Judging Days

The meadow at Eastfield was teeming with butterflies and wild flowers for the first judging but had been mown by the second, but was still appreciated by the judges as this is part of the cycle of a wild flower meadow.

The panels on Sandpits gates were up in time for the second judging and looked very bright and cheerful, thanks to all our young painters and to Sandpits for allowing us to put them up. Thanks too to Laraine and Nicky for organising the painters and to Derek Yeomans for cutting the wood for the panels.



The village looked lovely on both days so thank you to the villagers who weeded and swept their frontages, put out pots for display and helped to make the village look so good. It was a shame however that on both judging days there was fresh dog poo found on the corner of Church street and the High Street. Exactly where the judges would be walking. Luckily our advance party and CRiB members found it and disposed of it in time. Knowing there is a hefty fine for this I am surprised that this is still happening.

We won't know the results until the awards later in the year on October 11th in Newquay for South West in Bloom and on October 25th in London for the Britain in Bloom awards. Thank you to CRiB members who worked flat out weeding, watering and mulching before the days and to everyone in the village who helped to make it look so beautiful, let's hope the judges were impressed. Thank you to the WI who prepared a lovely buffet lunch in the village hall which we all enjoyed after the judging.



Having begun his presentation by 'singing' 'Don't Put Your Daughter on the Stage Mrs. Worthington...', Francis explained how his involvement in the theatre developed. He has produced or conducted over two hundred Amateur Operatic productions, and as his talk progressed it became very



apparent that not all the drama happens on stage! Amongst other events, he recounted

hilarious tales involving such as an orange wig, a donkey and a fire siren!

Historically, he explained, amateur productions used hav ricks from farms and a rick cloth on an earth floor for the stage, so dry weather was always preferable! A huge tarpaulin used to be hung between men and women performers for changing costumes, which were hired either from London Wardrobe or St Mary's in Bath. Francis played a 1927 recording of The English Rose, quite exceptional quality considering it was made by standing in front of a big horn. He played a later recording of Richard Tauber singing Vivo, which used an electric microphone, the improved quality evident.

With a final hilarious anecdote, Francis concluded his presentation, and I think everyone enjoyed the evening.

July brought us all together for our annual Garden Party, this year beautifully hosted by Gay Pocock. The evening was a great success, with well over 40 members and guests present enjoying a lovely warm evening, delicious food, copious amounts of



'liquid' and great company! There was definitely a buzz about it!



CARE FOR THE ENVIRONMENT RE-USE - REPAIR - RETURN - RECYCLE

f you ever wonder where our recycling ends up once it has been collected, you can visit somersetwaste.gov.uk for a breakdown of where and how things are recycled.

91% of collected recycling in Somerset is recycled and dealt with in this country and only 9% sent abroad. Their results for 2017/2018 are now available.

To reduce the amount of plastic we use remember to try the following:

- Take your own plastic tubs to supermarkets and butchers to reuse them and save plastic bags. The Black Sheep butchers in Langport uses paper to wrap their meat and Tesco will use your own tubs at the Deli counter.
- Buy loose veg that will avoid plastic trays and boxes but take your own bags to put them in. It is also usually cheaper to buy your fruit and veg loose.
- Take any plastic that our bin men won't take to the special Mixed Plastics bin in Tesco Langport supermarket carpark.
- Use a reusable water bottle.
- Order milk from the milkman such as 'Milk and More' google their website for more information.

A useful website to avoid buying plastic bottles is 'splosh.com' although you need plastic bottles to start with, you can order refills for shampoo, shower gel, washing up liquid, cleaning products etc. and the refill pouch can be returned and refilled again and again. You can even receive dishwasher tablets through the post in cardboard boxes that fit through your letter box!

Woodpeckers

There are two types of woodpecker that you might see in Curry Rivel - the Great Spotted woodpecker and the Green woodpecker.

The Great Spotted lives in wooded areas where they tap on tree trunks in order to find insects living in the bark and to make nest holes. They will also visit your garden if they see something to eat there. You might see them clinging to a tree trunk with their short legs and strong claws.


The Green woodpecker spends most of its time on the ground eating ants, ants and more ants!

Woodpecker Facts


- Green woodpeckers use their very long and sticky tongues to collect ants.
- You are most likely to hear the quite loud call KAK-KAK-KAK of the Green woodpecker this is known as a Yaffle.
- The Great Spotted makes a drumming sound by taping a tree with its specially reinforced beak.
- The white shiny eggs take about 12 days to hatch
- An adult **Great Spotted** weighs about 75 grams a bit less than an apple.
- An adult Green woodpecker weighs about 180 grams.

How to be Woodpecker Friendly

- Leave some wood logs in the garden where beetles, ants and spiders live which woodpeckers can find to eat.
- Great Spotted woodpeckers really like peanuts so to see them in your garden, hang up a peanut feeder.
- Don't forget they need a drink too, so a shallow bowl of water will help them.

View from the Pew

A church member writes about their faith and the difference it makes.

A personal account of what a difference becoming a Christian made to my life.

The day after I made a personal commitment to follow Jesus and asked him to forgive my sins, I was given an enormous love for my husband Ross, which surprised him exceedingly as our marriage at the time was rather careworn after 19 years and 3 teenage children! Despite this, he tried everything he could to change my mind because he was afraid that I was being taken away from him. After two weeks of verbal battering from him, he also became a Christian in a rather spectacular way, which he can tell you about himself if you ask him.
